

## RECENT ADDITIONS TO THE LIBRARY.

**Over Tyrolese Hills.** By F. S. Smythe.

A very readable book, which gives an account of a journey from Bludenz to Zell am See, describing ascents in the Silvretta, Oetz and Stubai, Zillerthal and Hohe Tauern. There are a number of fine illustrations.

**Everest: The Challenge.** By Sir Francis Younghusband.

This is a second edition, brought up to date with an account of the 1936 expedition. The author gives concise accounts of the various explorations of Everest and of ascents of some other peaks, and discusses in a very engaging manner the future of Himalayan mountaineering.

**Snow Structure and Ski Fields.** By Gerald Seligman.

An exhaustive study of snow in all its conditions. There is a profusion of excellent illustrations showing the various phases in the formation of snowbeds. The book gives clear information on the subject of how to judge and deal with snow conditions.

**The Highlands of Scotland.** By Hugh Quigley.

A very fascinating book written from the standpoint of a mountain Rambler. It contains a great deal of useful information, and is beautifully illustrated with over 100 photographs by R. M. Adam, a well-known Scottish photographer.

### OLDER BOOKS.

**Above the Snowline.** By C. T. Dent.

Accounts of expeditions between 1870 and 1880, including the first ascent of the Grand Dru and The Sudlenspitze. Dent's style of writing was very pleasing, his humour being rather suggestive of that of Leslie Stephen.

**Alpine Memories.** By Emile Javelle.

Includes an account of the first ascent of the Tour Noire. The style is very poetic, even rhapsodic at times, but wholly delightful.

**Ascent of Mount St. Elias.** By Filippo de Filippi.

An account of the ascent made by the Duke of the Abruzzi in 1898. Profusely illustrated from photographs by Vittorio Sella.

**Climbs in the New Zealand Alps.** By E. A. Fitzgerald.

Describes various new ascents made in 1895 around the Tasman glacier, including the first ascent of Mount Tasman. Well illustrated.

**Aconcagua and Tierra del Fuego.** By Sir Martin Conway.

Includes an account of the second ascent of Aconcagua, made some two years after its exploration by Fitzgerald and Vines. Written in Conway's usual attractive style.

**A Summer in Skye.** (2 vols.). By Alexander Smith.

A well-known classic, dealing with the history, legends, scenery and local customs of the island.

**Plant Life in Alpine Switzerland.** By E. A. N. Arber.

An excellent book of reference, written in a pleasing style which is not too technical. Numerous photographs.
